Stories of Faith

Note: Original manuscripts were done by the performers who were going to be the characters below. The theme was how God was faithful to each of these women. What follows is a guide that can be used, but I encourage you to have the performers tailor the script to their style and interpretation within reason. Scripts should be about 5 minutes each.

Eve (Based on Genesis 2,3)

God created us perfect in the garden. It was a beautiful and wonderful place to live. The best part was that God himself came to talk with us every day.
